- **1.** Open the nylon strap at the back and fold out the ball protection at the back.
- **2.** Lift up the hoof and pull the boot over it. Allow the horse to place their foot back down.
- **3.** Pull the nylon strap through the middle bar and metal eyelets.
- **4.** Now guide the nylon strap back through the metal eyelets and pull it tight.
- 5. Repeat this procedure on the other side and guide any remaining loose strap through the middle bar.

Care & Maintenance

Use cold water to remove mud and dirt from the boots.

Allow them to dry naturally. Direct exposure to heat can lead to damage.

Store the boots in a cool dry place.


Measuring correctly

The sizes of front and hind hooves often differ. Therefore it is important to measure them separately.

<u>Method 1:</u> Lift up the hoof and measure its broadest point. Then measure the length of the hoof, from the toe to the buttress line.

<u>Method 2:</u> Clean and oil the hoof, then allow the horse to set it down on paper. Measure the print created.

If the measurements deviate from the figures in the table, select the next largest boot.
